

Best practices for comment submission

In your letter, you must reference the CMS SNF Proposed Rule – <u>Minimum Staffing</u>

<u>Standards for Long-Term Care Facilities and Medizcaid Institutional Payment</u>

<u>Transparency Reporting (CMS-2023-0144-0001)</u>.

STAY PROFESSIONAL:

Courtesy and formality in your comments make your comments more likely to be considered and taken seriously. Avoid sarcasm and rants.

FOCUS ON THE FACTS:

Does the evidence presented by the agency justify the rule? Are facts or perspectives missing that will make the rule unworkable? Identify contradictions in the rule.

FOCUS ON THE RULE:

Is the rule making questionable assumptions about the state of the industry, availability of staff, census, etc.?

KEEP IT SHORT:

Concise comments, up to one page, are more than sufficient.

DRAW ATTENTION TO POOR DECISION BASIS:

By law, federal agencies are prohibited from submitting rules that disregard facts or don't have a reasonable basis for finalization. Think about the workforce challenges faced by the sector.

BE AUTHENTIC AND UNIQUE:

Your perspective matters! Use your experience in the sector, your role, the experiences of people you know, etc., to establish your credibility. You're an expert in this case!
